Enjoy the great outdoors in Huntington County!

With warm weather just beginning in Huntington County, residents and visitors alike have their sights on the many venues available for outdoor fun. Trails, parks, reservoirs, Markle Pool, Lake Clare and more provide opportunities to get outside and “enjoy the sunshine.”

Arbor Day/Earth Day will be celebrated in the County with the beginnings of an arboretum planned at Evergreen Park, 1370 Evergreen Road, Huntington. Community members are invited to help with the project on Saturday, April 30 from 9 a.m. to noon. Those interested in volunteering can complete an event registration found on the Huntington City/County website in the Evergreen Park Arboretum feature at www.huntington.in.us. Volunteers who register by April 12 will receive a free T-shirt, and experience with tree planting is not required.

A total of 80 trees of different varieties will be planted from April 28 through 30, and plans include walkable trails in the arboretum. Events such as weddings and other gatherings in an outdoor space are also a part of future plans. The area has been being readied for planting with the delivery of topsoil and ground leveling.

Huntington Parks & Recreation Department Superintendent Steve Yoder brought the initial idea of the arboretum to the Mayor’s Advisory Council on Environmental Stewardship (MACES), and the group has spearheaded the project. Funding has been received through a U.S. Forest Service grant awarded to the Indiana Department of Natural Resources Division of Forestry.

Along with Evergreen Park, the Parks Department strives to develop and maintain additional quality parks and facilities, and to preserve open/natural spaces in Huntington County. Overlooking the Wabash River, Evergreen Park also has overlook decks and covers 85 acres of land. The park offers playground equipment, a walking trail, an outdoor pavilion with a grill, a lighted ball diamond, sand volleyball and restrooms.

The Huntington Park system also in-

cludes Memorial Park, 1200 W. Park Drive, which also features a playground, covered pavilion, Pickle Ball courts, basketball court, restrooms, ponds, Sunken Gardens, Memorial Hills Disc Golf Course and the Veterans Memorial area. Drover Park, 1215 Etna Avenue, sits near the Terry R. Abbett Splash Park, 1255 Etna Avenue. Ball diamonds are featured near Elmwood Park, 1110 William Street.

General Slack Park, 929 Guilford Street, is named for a general from the Huntington area and is filled with enjoyable playground equipment. Hier’s Park, 547 S. Briant Street, is the site of Huntington County’s 4-H Fair and Forks of the Wabash Pioneer Festival and has playground equipment, covered pavilions, ball diamonds and enclosed buildings used for many community activities. Yeoman Park/Hayes-Lemmerz Skate Park is located at 900 W. Market Street. Additional parks include Laurie, 524 Swan Street, and Erie Park/BMX Pump Track, 936 Second Street.

The Parks Department desires to develop and maintain excellence in Huntington’s

parks, while conserving the environment and promoting health and well-being through recreational programs for Huntington residents. Biking, walking and running in scenic beauty can be found on Huntington’s growing network of trails also maintained by the Parks Department. Walk-A-Mile Wednesdays are a popular feature on area trails sponsored by the Parks Department. Visit the Huntington City/County website for the schedule.

Bike routes begin at Schenkel Station in downtown Huntington at 11 W. State Street. Five bike routes, detailed on maps found at Schenkel Station or on the Huntington Area Recreational Trails Association (HARTA) website, range in size from the Blue Route, 9.83 miles; Green Route, 5.04 miles; Orange Route, 4.50 miles; Yellow Route, 4.11 miles and Red Route, 4.05 miles. A weekly bike ride leaves from Schenkel Station on Wednesdays, from May 4 through October 5. The ride begins at 6 p.m. and concludes at 7:30 p.m.

Huntington's system of trails. A beautiful walk along the Wabash River begins at the Lime City Trail head located on West Park Drive across from Huntington Nursery. This trail includes the Historic Forks of the Wabash Park showcasing the Nuck House, Schoolhouse and the Chief Richardville home. This trail keeps growing with a series of wooden walkways and bridges constructed by Forks' volunteers.

The contributions of the Erie Railroad to the history of Huntington are celebrated on the Erie Rail Trail. It begins at Hier's Park and continues north across a historic Erie Railroad bridge and then goes on through Yeoman Park. From the park, the trail goes through the Erie rail bed to Gragg Street. It

provides access to city parks, Parkview Huntington Hospital, Parkview Huntington Family YMCA, Crestview Middle School and Huntington University. The Old U.S.-24 Trail connects to the Erie Trail at the cor-

ner of Briant and Old U.S.-24. The Etna Trail travels along Etna Avenue beginning at Jessup Street and ends at Waterworks Road.

Acres Land Trust also maintains areas for connecting with nature and hiking in Huntington County. Tel-Hy Nature Preserve, 1429 N 300 W, 1.1 miles, and Pehkokia Woods, 1570 Flaxmill Road, 1.9 miles, are two such areas open daily until 9 p.m.

J. Edward Roush Lake (Huntington Lake) provides outdoor fun with many boating and hiking opportunities. Salomonie Lake offers many opportunities for boating, hiking, swimming, camping, fishing, hunting and more.

Markle Pool, 100 Park Drive, Markle, is the place to swim in the warm, summer months. Complete with clean water, beach area, slides, concession stand, restrooms and is wheelchair accessible, area residents and guests can swim for a small fee.

The Huntington Farmer's Market will move to Lake Clare, at the corner of Old U.S.-24 and Broadway, beginning in June for the 2022 season. The Market will join food trucks, live music and children's activities along the lake for a festive summer activity each Wednesday from 4 to 7 p.m.

Organized activities in Huntington County for families and children are scheduled at the Parkview Huntington Family YMCA, the Huntington Police Athletic League (PAL), at Huntington County Baseball, in additional sporting programs in each community, musical productions, festivals and more.

Many entities have worked diligently to bring the system of trails and outdoor accessibility to Huntington County residents over the years. Bring the family to these enjoyable adventures in nature and see all that Huntington County has to offer.

Healthy Kids Day, Fun Run, 5K, April 23

Parkview Huntington Family YMCA is hosting the 2022 Healthy Kids Day, Fun Run and 5K events on Saturday, April 23, 2022.



The one mile Fun Run / Walk is free to the community and kicks off at 9 a.m. from the YMCA. The Fun Run course will be completed in the vicinity of the YMCA. We ask participants not bring dogs to the race. Registration is required but the Fun Run / Walk is free to participants.

The 5K steps off at 9:30 a.m. near the Y and the course route has runners going through the beautiful Huntington University Campus and returning to the Y via the Gragg Street trail (which runs parallel to Stults Road). Awards will be given for male and female age division winners.

Both races offer t-shirts to the first 100 who sign up and finisher ribbons for kids ages 14 and under. Racers and walkers may register for the events on the YMCA website at www.huntingtony.org (under "register") or by calling the Y at (260) 359-9622. Race day registration will also be available.

In addition to the races on April 23, the Y is also hosting their annual FREE Healthy Kids Day in the Y gymnasium and is open to all community members. Healthy Kids Day offers a Community Connections EXPO with booths from area agencies from 9 a.m. until noon, free Lions Club Vision Screenings from 9 to 11 a.m., program presentations and entertainment from 9:15 a.m. to 12 noon, and open swim from 12 noon to 2 p.m. Open swim is free to the community but requires registration to attend. Door prizes will be given during the EXPO.

Funds raised from the 5K benefit the Y's campaign for financial assistance. In 2021 the Parkview Huntington Family YMCA awarded over \$115,000 in scholarship to the Huntington community. The annual campaign enables the YMCA to not turn anyone away from membership or programs based on their ability to pay.

"The Y is excited to offer this day of events that promotes fun, fitness and philanthropy," says YMCA CEO, Todd Latta. "We encourage community members to grab a few friends, co-workers or family members and sign up to join us for the 5K as well as stopping in the gym to take part in Healthy Kids Day activities."
