## **Christmas in the City to be celebrated November 27**

Downtown Huntington will be filled with the delights of the season for Christmas in the City, Saturday, November 27. From 3 to 5:30 p.m. children along with their families are invited to celebrate Christmas with games, pony rides, a petting zoo, Christmas tree lighting at Rotary Centennial Park, a visit to Santa at the Courthouse and more.

The Downtown Business Association (DBA) Heart of Huntington along with the City of Huntington and the Huntington County Chamber of Commerce organize Christmas in the City each year, and the activities are free to those who attend. The opportunities for fun will be located in various places throughout the downtown area. Downtown stores and restaurants will also be open.

Adults also have a special part in Christmas in the City, and may pick up a "passport" at The Party Shop for shopping Friday and Saturday. The passport will be stamped at locations downtown where a purchase is made. The completed passport with at least

five stamps can be turned into HomeCraft – The Art of Home, 400 N. Jefferson Street (second block), and prizes will be awarded to three lucky winners. Chamber Bucks will be awarded to first place, \$125; second, \$75; third place, \$50.

Saturday, November 27 will begin with Donuts with Santa at the Huntington County Historical Museum, 315 Court Street, from 10 to 11 a.m. Milk and donuts will be provided, and an opportunity will be offered to write a "Letter to Santa." Call the museum at (260) 356-7264 and leave a message to place your reservation for the event. Reservations are required and space is limited.

Visits with Santa will take place in the beautifully decorated Courthouse rotunda from 3 to 5 p.m. Children can tell their Christmas wishes to Santa seated nearby, and family pictures will be taken at no charge by Frederick's Photography. Those visiting Santa are encouraged to come early to ensure that there is time to get their picture taken. Children's games, sponsored by Smith Furniture, will be offered in the first block of downtown on Jefferson Street. Games include Tic Tac Toe; Snowman Bowling, Bean Bag Toss, Can Toss and a Sven Ring Toss. Children can pluck a treat from a lollipop Christmas tree, and The Indiana Dream Center will help with games. Jasmine and Thor will be on hand to greet children at the Downtown Salon and provide photo opportunities. Bend the Trend Boutique & Décor will host visits with Cindy Lou Who and her dog Max. Goody gift bags for children will be given by Not too Shabby.

Visits and photos with Christmas Belle from Beauty and the Beast will be located inside of Huntington's newest shop, The Fiber Alchemist, 442 N. Jefferson Street, in the second block of downtown. HomeCraft – The Art of Home, at the tip of the second block, will offer a gift wrapping demonstration every half an hour and cookie decorating. HomeCraft will also host a six foot

The third block of downtown will feature a Nativity Scene in the windows of the Meal Ministry where hot chocolate, by the Meal Ministry, and cookies, by the Brick House Grill, will be served inside. Buddy the Elf and Jovie will greet children at Little Sweets Spot candy store, 315 N. Jefferson Street. Live reindeer and an alpaca, sponsored by Duke Energy and Bendix, will be a favorite area for children to visit. Pony rides and a petting zoo will enchant children, also in the third block, sponsored by ProFed Credit Union, Fort Wayne. Face painting will take place at the Fifth Parlor hair salon, Market Street.

The Grinch and Snoopy will be on hand while stories are read in the Huntington Arts and Entrepreneurial Center, Franklin Street (across from the Courthouse). 

## **COVID-19 spotlights urgency** for manufacturing 4.0

Manufacturing is amidst another revolution, thanks to the capabilities data and machine learning have expanded from the previous revolution's adoption of computers and automation. Manufacturing 4.0 represents the next wave of manufacturing, using automation, IoT, AI and other technology to optimize factory efficiency.

Throughout U.S. history, manufacturers have been instrumental in emergence from the destruction and disarray of wars and the despair and distress of economic recessions. Now, with COVID-19, manufacturers have mobilized to meet the greatest health and economic threat of our time - further solidifying its status as an essential industry.

However, even before the pandemic, the industry has been facing a skills gap, with as many as 2.1 million positions expected to go unfilled in manufacturing over the next decade.1 While 63% of manufacturing jobs lost during the pandemic have been recouped, manufacturers are still reporting that finding the right talent is 36% harder than it was in 2018, despite an unemployment rate that has nearly doubled the supply of available workers.

This labor gap has accelerated the urgency for manufacturing 4.0 throughout the industry and the need for 4.0 transformation has captured the attention of many manufacturing leadership teams at a completely new level following the impact of COVID-19, including:

- Increased focus on real-time data and analytics
- · Accelerated digital transformation initiatives

• Increased drive towards collaborative enterprises, and remote or virtual working/operations/monitoring

- · Established safer working practices and environments
- Focused leadership on digital opportunities, transformation
- · Improved preparedness, more resilient supply chains

Manufacturing 4.0 is changing the landscape for the industry; and not only is it changing the processes within the factory, it's also changing the skills needed to perform these jobs. In addition to hiring for these skills, many manufacturers are also investing in upskilling and reskilling their current employees on these new technologies. Today's manufacturing is an exciting industry, fueled by technology and individuals who are conceiving life-changing ideas, making a difference and improving the lives of others.

## Chamber holds After Hours at the Learning Center



A Chamber After Hours was held at an open house for the Huntington County Community Learning Center. A large crowd came out to celebrate the opening of the Learning Center's expansion on October 21.

A ribbon cutting was held on September

21 opening the new area, and tours were held at the Chamber After Hours for all in attendance. The expansion adds 20,478 square feet to the Learning Center for a total of 49,784 square feet at a total cost of \$4,156,620. Those in attendance toured the new 2,907 square-foot welding bay and classroom, the advanced manufacturing lab and classroom, the criminal justice area and simulation room, remote learning lab and industrial maintenance classroom and lab.

The original Learning Center opened in September 15, 2016 with an area of 29,603 square feet, and a total construction cost of \$1.45 million. As a hub for career readiness, job search, workplace certifications and college learning opportunities, the programs at the Learning Center are designed to improve the skills of high school students and adult learners in Huntington County to meet the workforce needs of local industries.

Courses in automotive, certified nurse aide, criminal justice, emergency medical technician, precision machining and welding, industrial maintenance, CNC machining and various other academic courses are offered at the Learning Center. The courses are offered for industry certification and/or college dual credit.


