## **Bowen Health Clinic offering primary healthcare**

Bowen Center introduced the public to its newest health clinic Wednesday. The primary healthcare clinic is co-located with Bowen Center's Huntington mental health outpatient offices, and offers an integrated approach to healthcare for infants, children, adolescents and adults. In addition to the Huntington location, Bowen Center recently opened health clinics in Fort Wayne and Warsaw with more planned.

The Community Mental Health Center's move into integrated care addresses the strong link between mental and physical health. By integrating mental and physical healthcare under one roof, the center's goal is to reach underserved populations, improve their quality of life and extend their life expectancy by treating the whole person

"What this means is our friends in the Huntington community are going to have better access to healthcare," said Dr. Tanner Babb, a member of Bowen Center's board of directors. "The advantage of having all one's healthcare needs met in one location and often in the same appointment, is a continuity of care which demonstrates that all aspects of a patient's health is valued."

"When patients are cared for in this holistic manner it leads to better health outcomes and healthier communities," said Emily Vanderpool, Bowen Health Clinic Nurse Practitioner. "Our goal in this clinic is to not only provide care to anyone who walks through our doors, but to do so in a kind and compassionate manner. We intend to educate and empower our patients to be advocates for their own health and wellbeing," said Ms. Vanderpool.

Matt Ditzler, director of the Huntington Community Foundation and a member of Bowen Center's board of directors, points to a speaker at a recent statewide conference who said that for the most vulnerable populations, the emergency room is often someone's first visit to a doctor. "This line stuck with me as I believe it truly underscores the access issues that exist in our current healthcare system," said Ditzler. "Through this

new Bowen Health Clinic, our friends and neighbors in Huntington County are going to have greater access to local, quality healthcare."

The challenges that adults with mental illness face are made more difficult if they are living in poverty and both factors can mean a shorter life expectancy. "Why do people living in poverty and especially those with mental illness live shorter lives? We know why. They have complex health needs trying to navigate a fragmented and costly health system," said Dr. Robert Ryan, Bowen Center senior vice president of operations. "For over 20 years, research has shown that many of the years lost to mental illness can be returned to the person if they have access to integrated care, care provided in a setting where multidisciplinary teams work together for the good to the patient, have improved access to care (or income-based care), knowledge motivation. Bowen Center is perfectly positioned to help all of these contributing factors. Physical health, psychiatry, dental health, optometry and pharmacy all working together for the good of the patient. Today in Huntington we're taking our first step in that integrative care model with the promise of more services to come," said Dr. Ryan.

Huntington Mayor Richard Strick recognized Bowen Center's legacy of providing mental healthcare services to Huntington and northern Indiana, and the enhanced services it will now offer. "We welcome this new chapter in the lives of this community's people," said Mayor Strick.

Bowen Health Clinic in Huntington is located at 2860 Northpark Avenue. Medicaid, Medicare and private insurance is welcome, but no one is turned away for an inability to pay. Same or next day appointments are available. Call (888) 470-0082 to make an appointment or for more information.

## **Applications being accepted for Healing Partners**

Huntington County Healing Partners, a funding alliance uniting the Huntington County Medical Society and Parkview Huntington Hospital (PHH) in a shared vision for improving community health and well-being, has announced the timetable for its 2022 grant cycle.

The application period for 2022 Healing Partners grant funding opens April 8 and will close May 20. The grants are available to organizations that tackle pressing local health issues in ways that promote better health and greater vitality for people throughout Huntington County. Applications and other information are available at https://www.huntingtonhealingpartners.org.

A 2020 gift of more than \$1.28 million from the Huntington County Medical Society established a permanent endowment at Parkview Huntington Foundation that is the key revenue source for the Huntington County Healing Partners program. The cooperative effort of the medical society and PHH provides annual grant funding for programs and equipment related to initiatives targeting public health priorities identified in the Huntington County Health Needs Assessment.

Conducted by Parkview Health every three years, the needs assessment identifies trends in health among Huntington County residents. The most recent assessment, completed for 2020-22, cited health priorities in the county that include chronic disease treatment/management, access to healthy foods, obesity, mental health, and substance use and abuse, among other findings.

Eleven local agencies were awarded a total of \$59,895 in the 2021 round of grants, which launched the Healing Partners program.

"The Healing Partners program allows us to best direct money to activities that will have the biggest impact on the health and wellness of Huntington County," said Matt Pflieger, DO, Medical Society vice president and Huntington County health officer. "The needs of a community shift with time and we want to ensure we are staying in line with those needs – creating an environment that helps people live their best lives."

A committee of representatives from the medical society and the hospital reviews qualifying grant applications and administers the Healing Partners program. PHH contributes toward the grants from funds set

aside annually for its Community Health Improvement work.

"So many factors contribute to health and well-being," said Doug Selig, president, PHH, "from access to health care and nutritious food to affordable housing, reliable transportation, supportive social services and more. Recognizing that major change requires substantial resources, the Healing Partners alliance aims to cast a wider net, inviting more solutions from groups that are new or have not been able to participate in

past grant funding through the Community Health Improvement program. We want to give good ideas the momentum they need to begin making a difference for even more people."

Applications should be for program funding only. Applications and other information are available at https://www.huntingtonhealingpartners.org. The selected grant recipients will be notified in early June.

## **PHH hosting two Check-Up Days**

Parkview Huntington Hospital (PHH) and the Parkview Center for Healthy Living are teaming up to offer two Check-Up Day events in May. Taking advantage of reduced-cost lab testing at Check-Up Day can help area residents keep an eye on their health and well-being.

Check-Up Day will take place in PHH's Wellness Classrooms on two Wednesdays, May 4 and 18, from 7 to 9:30 a.m. Currently, plenty of appointments are available for May 18, but appointments for May 4 are more limited.

Changes have been made to test packages and pricing for 2022. Fasting is not required for these single tests: glycohemoglobin A1C (\$30) and thyroid stimulating hormone, known as TSH (\$35).

Wellness packages have been simplified from the past. Instead of packages A, B, C and D, participants can now choose from the customizable Green Package and the deluxe Diamond Package.

The Green Package includes a lipid profile and glycohemoglobin A1C for \$50. In addition, participants can opt to add any of these tests onto the Green Package: comprehensive metabolic profile (CMP), \$25; complete blood count (CBC), \$15; thyroid stimulating hormone (TSH), \$30; prostate specific antigen (PSA, for men), \$30; and vitamin D, \$40.

The Diamond Package consists of the basic Green Package PLUS the CMP, CBC, TSH and PSA for a total cost of \$115. Those who wish to purchase a Diamond Package without the PSA may do so for \$100.

The vitamin D test can be added to either Diamond Package for a fee of \$40. Anyone selecting a wellness package must fast for 10 to 12 hours before their appointment. During fasting, sips of water and regular medications as prescribed are fine. Questions may be directed to (260) 266-6500.


This is an appointment-only event; walk-ins cannot be accepted. Participants must pre-register by calling (260) 266-6500. Callers should leave a message including their name and phone number if a Parkview Center for Healthy Living team member is not available at the time of the call. Payment by credit card at the time of pre-registration is required.




